





Argha took the initiative to construct a transgender toilet in the college with the help of college authorities. This makes the college the first institution in West Bengal and the second in the country, after Punjab




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

To celebrate National Nutrition Month, 2022, the Department of Food & Nutrition, Kanchrapara College and IQAC cell of Kanchrapara College jointly organized an outreach program on menstrual hygiene among adolescent school girls.

This was an excellent initiative taken by the department and IQAC cell of the college as menstrual health is a fundamental concern among adolescent girls to maintain a healthy reproductive life.



National Nutrition Month 2022 was themed "Poshan Maah" by the National Institute of Nutrition, India. To celebrate this occasion, the department decided to organize an outreach program to educate school students about menstrual hygiene and nutrition during adolescence and reproductive age.

#### Mission:

- ➤ Celebration of National Nutrition Month, 2022
- ➤ Celebration of 50 years of Kanchrapara College
- > Organize an outreach programme

### Vision:

- ➤ Awareness generation about menstrual health and hygiene among adolescent school girls
- > Preparing semester's students to communicate with common people

For this purpose, the students of the Department of Food & Nutrition, Kanchrapara College with two faculty members and lab attendants were sent to a locally situated girls' school.

### **Programme Details**

At 11 am on 13. 09. 2022, five students, with two faculty members and one laboratory attendant, arrived at the girls' school. More than 70 students and 15 teachers were gathered in the hall as the audience. First, all the college students and the faculty members communicated with the school students in a friendly way. This was to create an ambiance where students could freely talk about their menstrual problems to us as teenage girls are still shy about discussing menstruation openly. So first we made them understand that menstruation is a normal biological process and there is nothing to hide.

After a general interaction and counselling session, students from our department presented a model of the female reproductive system. They also delivered lectures about reproductive organs and menstrual bleeding.



Then, nutrition education was given to the school children. Students of our department made the school students understand basic nutritional needs during menstruation and the whole period of adolescence.

Afterward, students were taught basic menstrual hygiene. They are advised to use sanitary napkins, tampons, etc. The importance of maintaining hygiene and cleanliness of innerwear was also discussed.

Our students were talking about all the taboos we have created in our society regarding menstruation, which have no scientific basis.

A meeting with the school student was held to answer their questions at the end of this session.



A pack of two sanitary napkins was given to each audience member at the last session.

All in all, the whole event was wrapped in the joy and satisfaction of raising awareness, at least to a small but important segment of our people, about such an important and critical issue.
